

### Education Messages/Myths

θ Technical/Vocational classes are for students who can't achieve academically



### Research and Statistics

Approximately 30% of all full time equivalency students enrolled in technical and community colleges already have a baccalaureate

degree.

 $\boldsymbol{\theta}$   $\,$  A 4 year college degree will guarantee success.

 $\theta$  Paraprofessional/technical jobs will show the greatest growth through the year 2010.

### Education Message/Myth

 $\theta \qquad \text{Technical courses are not for college prep students}$ 

### Research and Statistics

θ Through 2010, 20% of jobs will require a Bachelor's Degree and 60% will require an Associate Degree.

### Education Message/Myth

 $\boldsymbol{\theta}$  — The four year degree is the only degree worth having.

 $\theta \,$   $\,$  50 % of all students who prepare for a professional job - bachelor's degree - will end up underemployed.

### Education Message/Myth

 $\boldsymbol{\theta}$  . If you have a four year degree, you will be successful.

### Research and Statistics

 $\theta=30$  - 40 % of recent 4 year college graduates will get a job for which a 4 year degree is not required.

### Education Message/Myth

 $\boldsymbol{\theta}$   $\quad$  You need a four year degree to get a quality job.

## **FACT**

### In West Virginia

•62 out of 100 students enter a 4 year college.
•15 earn a college degree.
•7.5 get a job in their career field

University **enrollment** is at an all time high.

University **drop out rates** are at an all time high.

University **underemployment** is at an all time high.


- Focus on post-secondary success not on college admissions
